Barb,

I am responding to the FOIA request you forwarded to me last week, which requests copies of communications between myself and Trustee McGuire. Under the cases <u>Quinn v. Stone</u> and <u>City of Champaign v.</u> <u>Madigan</u> I do not believe that an individual trustee is a "public body" whose email communications or other records are subject to disclosure under the Freedom of Information Act. Therefore, to the extent such communications exist, they are not subject to disclosure.

Further, assuming such records were subject to FOIA requests, section 7(1)(f) of the FOIA act exempts from disclosure "Preliminary drafts, notes, recommendations, memoranda and other records in which opinions are expressed, or policies or actions are formulated." Communications between trustees, even if subject to FOIA, would fall under this exemption.

I ask that your response to the FOIA request assert these and all other arguments against the legality of the request made.
