- **1. Family History:** At the time of the flood and currently Client lives alone. Client reported no legal issues pertaining to the flood.
- **2. Education/Training/Employment:** Client did not quit school or specialized training as a result of the flood. No school-aged children in the household.

Client stated his water heater is not heating properly, furnace "makes a noise and smells funny," and gas dryer is not drying properly. Client stated no problems with washer. Client stated he has not replaced his freezer and lost some food inside. Client stated he was able to "salvage" carpet. Client replaced chain saw. Client stated he is "maintaining" monthly bills. Client state his house is paid off and he had proof of ownership.
- 10 5. Case Management: Client stated he received no funds for flood damage. Client reported no loss of child/adult daycare services. Client stated he has done without necessities in order to make ends meet. Client reported no need for home base/homemaker services. Client stated he is not receiving services from another provider.
- **O 6. Transportation:** Client stated his vehicle did not sustain any flood damage. Client stated he has car insurance. Client reported no increase in mileage or gas getting to work.
