NARRATIVE:			

I was on Roosevelt at Lambert facing east when I first observed Clay's Jeep. The Jeep was in the center left turn lane facing east with it's left turn signal on. The Jeep was attempting to turn into the parking lot at 352 Roosevelt. When the the Jeep made the turn it drove up over the curb, over the parkway and into the parking lot. The Jeep then exited onto to Hillcrest southbound to Roosevelt then turned westbound on Roosevelt. After the light had turned green, at Lambert, I was able to get behind the Jeep. I activated my emergency lights and the Jeep pulled onto northbound Newton where it stopped. There was no damage to the decorative brick pavers that are in the parkway at 352 Roosevelt which Clay drove over.

I approached the Jeep and identified myself and advised Clay why I had stopped her and asked for her driver's license. Clay was able to produce her driver's license without difficulty and as she spoke I smelled the odor of an alcoholic beverage on her breath and I saw her eyes were bloodshot. I asked her if she had been drinking and she said she had two Guinnesses. I ran Clay through LEADS [REDACTED]. I asked Clay if she would step out of her vehicle to perform field sobriety tests and she said yes.

I began by telling Clay to let me give her the instructions and demonstrate each test before she attempted each test.

The first test I explained and demonstrated was the 30 count one leg stand. Clay began the test before I had completed the explanation and demonstration and when she performed the test she counted wrong, she

placed her right foot on the ground on the count of 13, 14, and 15. Clay repositioned herself and began to count from 15 and on the count of 27 the test was stopped because Clay's foot was on the ground.

The second test I explained and demonstrated was the nine step walk and turn test. Again, Clay attempted to begin the test before I had completed the explanation and demonstration. Clay did walk nine steps out and nine steps back. Clay did not walk heel to toe for any of the steps.

The third test I explained and demonstrated was the finger to nose. Clay was hesitant with both her right and left hands.

The final test I asked Clay to perform was the Preliminary Breat Test (PBT). I explained to Clay how to perform this test. Clay first attempted this test three times and the PBT voided out because of a NoGo on each attempt. The PBT was reset and I explained again to Clay how to perform this and on her fourth attempt Clay blew a .149 BAC.

I advised Clay I was placing her under arrest for driving under the influence of alcohol. I handcuffed (checked for snugness and double locked for safety) Clay and placed her in the rear seat of squad 18. I then transported Clay to the PD where I read her the warning to motorist. The GEPD Intox EC/IR was not operating so I transported Clay to the Wheaton PD. Using the Wheaton PD Intox EC/IR breath machine Clay blew a .108 BAC. We then returned to the Glen Ellyn PD where I read Clay her "rights" under Miranda. Clay said she understood and did not need a lawyer in order to talk with me. I then completed the Alcohol Influence Report (AIR). I then completed GE ticket number GE021037 for negligent driving. I also completed a two count complaint for DUI and read it to Clay. Clay was fingerprinted and photographed and with Sgt Acton's #21 approval Clay was released on a I-Bond with a court date of August 30, 2001 at 0900 hours. I then transported Clay to her residence. Clay's Jeep was towed by Kevin's Towing to their lot at 332 E North Ave, Villa Park (TX [REDACTED] 5) this information was given to Clay.
