




Iroquois West School District Community Survey -- PHONE July 2018

Executive Summary

In July 2018, UNICOM-ARC conducted a telephone survey of registered voter households in the Iroquois West School District. The purpose of the survey was to better understand area residents' perceptions of and priorities for the District. **One hundred (100) surveys** were completed, and complete results of every question asked are included in the accompanying overview of data.

Rating the District

Most respondents rated Iroquois West Community Unit School District 10 highly, with three in five grading it an "A" (21.0%) or "B" (40.0%). Very few respondents rated it a "D" (2.0%) or "F" (1.0%).

Statements about the District

Solid majorities of respondents agreed with several **"statements that people might make about public education."** Respondents were most likely to agree with statements that touched on the value that residents receive for taxes paid to the District and the importance of that investment. By contrast, relatively few respondents agreed that local schools do not need improvements.

- We get an excellent educational value for the taxes we pay to Iroquois West School District. (85.0%, strongly/somewhat agree)
- Supporting public schools is the best thing we can do to protect the investment we've made in our homes. (84.0%)
- **Building a new school will save lots of money** in the long run when considering long term operations, maintenance and repairs. (72.0%)
- The quality of our public schools is the most important factor regarding property values in our area. (69.0%)
- **People like me can't afford to pay higher property taxes, no matter how good the cause.** (67.0%)
- Our district has the lowest tax rate in the area. **I'm willing to pay more** to make sure our kids have the same educational opportunities as children in other districts. (65.0%)
- Our schools are fine just the way they are. Nothing needs to be done to improve them beyond normal maintenance and repairs. (26.0%)

Community engagement awareness and future planning

When asked how aware they were of a “series of community engagement meetings to get input on a long range building improvement plan,” more than two thirds of respondents were either “very” (41.0%) or “somewhat” (27.0%) aware of this effort.

Respondents were also told the following:

Over the next 20 years, state required repairs to existing buildings are estimated to cost \$18.6 million. Another \$20 million more would be needed to bring instructional spaces up to date for a total of nearly \$40 million.

Almost two thirds said that they either “strongly” (33.0%) or “somewhat” (31.0%) agreed with this approach.

Possible bond proposal

Respondents were asked about a **possible bond proposal** on behalf of the District, which was described as follows:

The option favored in the engagement meetings was a single K through 12 building to replace the district’s five buildings. The first phase would start with a new high school funded by a \$28 million bond proposal. **The other grades would be added when funding allows.** If the district placed a \$28 million bond proposal on the ballot to fund this proposal, is this something you would strongly favor...

When asked about this proposal near the beginning of the survey, a majority (55.0%) of respondents said that they favored the proposal, while about a third (31.0%) said that they opposed it. When asked again about the proposal near the end of the survey, support rose somewhat, with 61.0% in favor and 30.0% opposed.

Statements about a possible proposal for a single K-12 building

Respondents were read a number of statements that “people might make a possible proposal for a single K-12 school building” and asked how strongly they agreed or disagreed with each. Respondents were most likely to agree with statements that highlighted the need for building improvements, while far fewer agreed that it is enough to maintain the status quo.

- The newest building in our district is more than a half century old. It only makes sense that we need to take steps to improve our school facilities. (80.0%, total agree)
- Following consolidation, it makes no long term financial sense to continue operating five school buildings. (76.0%)
- Investing in improved school buildings now will benefit many future generations of students and homeowners. (75.0%)
- A new high school would be a source of pride for our community. (74.0%)
- Improving our schools is a critically important step to take to bring economic growth to our area. (74.0%)
- Many years ago, people in our community stepped up and built up-to-date school buildings for their children. It is our turn to do the same thing. (71.0%)
- It makes no financial sense to put more money into our old buildings. A new building makes better long term financial sense. (68.0%)
- A new K-12 school building is a nice idea. But our community simply can't afford something like that. We need to make do with what we have. (48.0%)
- Our schools are fine the way they are. They just need a little updating and repair work. (26.0%)







01. Students are often given the grades A, B, C, D, and F to score the quality of their academic work. What grade would you give to Iroquois West Community Unit School District 10?


