An allegation was brought to the attention of the McHenry County State's Attorney's (MCSA) Office about official misconduct conducted by Robert Miller while he was sitting as Algonquin Township Highway Commissioner. Specifically that Miller was involved in the inappropriate conduct while holding the office of Highway Commissioner for Algonquin Township. MCSA is investigating this matter at the request of the Illinois State Police.

On 02/07/2018 at approximately 1630 hours, I, Inv. Laura King, Arrived at the residence of Daniel E. Wacyk (M/W DOB: 11/26/1938), located at 714 Three Oaks Road, Cary IL. A gentleman who identified himself as Wacyk was in the driveway upon my arrival. I introduced myself and showed him my credentials and explained I had some questions for him related to an investigation I was working on. The following is a summary of my conversation with Wacyk and not a verbatim transcription of the contents of the conversation.

I asked Wacyk if he was employed by the Algonquin Township Road District and he stated he was. I asked what capacity he was employed in and he stated he was a bus driver for the senior bus. I asked about the duration of his employment and he stated he had worked there on a part time basis for the past eight years. I asked Wacyk what his rate of pay was and he stated \$15.USC per hour.

I brought Wacyk's attention to the late November and mid-December pay periods and told him the records I was reviewing indicated he received extra pay, classified as miscellaneous pay, on those checks. Wacyk stated he remembered getting extra money and that it was possibly overtime. I explained that overtime was listed as a separate line item. Wacyk then stated it was possibly a bonus. I asked Wacyk how he knew if was a bonus; if there was ever a conversation about the pay checks containing extra money. He stated it was common knowledge that there would be some extra money in a check before the holidays. I pointed out that some years he received more money than other years. I asked if he knew what caused that to occur. He stated he did not know but if he had to guess it was probably something with the budget. I pointed out he also received miscellaneous pay in April of 2014 and asked what that was for. He stated he did not remember what that was for but it was possibly incentive pay for a weekend trip with the seniors, but he did not really remember. I explained to Wacyk that it was suggested that some of the pay might have been made in exchange for political favors. Wacyk stated that never happened. Wacyk stated he offered to do things for Robert Miller and he was not allowed to conduct any of those activities during work hours. I thanked Wacyk for his time and left his driveway at approximately 1640 hours.
