- 1 THE WITNESS: At what time?
- 2 BY MR. HANLON:
- 3 Q. In the morning.
- 4 A. No.
- 5 Q. Not at all?
- 6 A. Not on that date. Not in the morning.
- 7 Q. Are you presently employed?
- 8 A. No.
- 9 Q. I'm going to give you some dates, and on
- 10 these dates can you just tell me whether or not you're
- employed on any of these dates, all of which being in
- 12 2019. August 19th?
- MR. BROWN: Your Honor, objection as to
- 14 relevance as to his employment on those dates.
- 15 THE COURT: Counsel.
- MR. HANLON: Opposing counsel asked the
- 17 petitioner if she knew how Mr. Norton was employed
- 18 during her examination. If it was relevant for him,
- 19 it's relevant for us.
- THE COURT: That objection is overruled.
- THE WITNESS: What was your question again?
- 22 BY MR. HANLON:
- Q. Let's start with the month of August. Were
- 24 you employed during the month of August, 2019?

- 1 A. No.
- Q. Were you employed during the month of
- 3 September, 2019?
- 4 A. No.
- 5 Q. I would like to direct your attention to
- 6 August 15, 2019. You were present in the Dollar
- 7 General store on August 15, 2019; isn't that correct?
- 8 A. I don't exactly recall the date.
- 9 Q. Well, did anything unusual happen on August
- 10 15, 2019?
- 11 A. I don't remember the dates of any time. I've
- 12 been in there numerous times.
- 13 Q. All right. Did you ever have an altercation
- 14 with Ms. Forsythe on August 15, 2019 or any other date
- 15 in the month of August of this year?
- 16 A. Altercation, no.
- 17 Q. Okay. Now, you seem to pars words on the
- 18 word altercation, so did you have any other dealings
- 19 with Ms. Forsythe in the Dollar General store during
- 20 the month of August, 2019?
- 21 A. No.
- 22 Q. None whatsoever?
- 23 A. None that I can recall. You keep speaking
- 24 low and looking down. I can't read your lips.
