2 BY MR. HANLON:

3 Q. In the morning.

4 A. No.

5 Q. Not at all?

6 A. Not on that date. Not in the morning.

7 Q. Are you presently employed?

8 A. No.

10 these dates can you just tell me whether or not you're  
11 employed on any of these dates, all of which being in

13          Q.    All right.  Did you ever have an altercation  
14  with Ms. Forsythe on August 15, 2019 or any other date  
15  in the month of August of this year?

16          A.    Altercation, no.

17          Q.    Okay.  Now, you seem to pars words on the  
18  word altercation, so did you have any other dealings  
19  with Ms. Forsythe in the Dollar General store during  
20  the month of August, 2019?

21          A.    No.

22          Q.    None whatsoever?

23          A.    None that I can recall.  You keep speaking  
24  low and looking down.  I can't read your lips.
