**EMERGENCY MOTION
FOR ORDER TO VACATE
ORDER OF PROTECTION**

NOW COMES Plaintiff, JOHN NORTON, to bring this EMERGENCY MOTION, and, in support of his EMERGENCY MOTION, NORTON states as follows:

1: That on June 15, 2020, Respondent Norton was found NOT GUILTY in Case 19 OV 2222, that involved a complaint filed by the Petitioner;

2: That the Honorable Judge Jessica Colon-Sayre ruled that the Petitioner knew of the Respondents character and demeanor from previous contacts during the performance of his duties and responsibilities as Wesley Township Highway Commissioner and during many Township meetings;

3: That the Petitioner did intentionally instigated contact with the Respondent, as shown in video evidence presented in Open Court by the Respondent;

4: That the Respondents actions, as alleged in the City of Wilmington's complaint, DID NOT meet the criteria of an Ordinance Violation;

5: That the Respondent filed a Motion of Discovery for copies of records of all disciplinary action and all written complaints filed by residents with both the City of Wilmington and it's associated Police Department involving Officer Jose Campos, the arresting officer in Case 19 OV 2222;

6: That Officer Jose Campos was placed on administrative leave in which to preclude him from testifying in Open Court and Bench Trial, to preclude his written report from being entered into the record as evidence, and also to deny and suppress the Respondents Motion of Discovery;

7: That the Petitioner, by her own admission, in Open Court, did state under cross examination that she intentionally followed the Respondent to various locations, on September 20, 2020 and again on May 12, 2020, for the purposes of taking pictures of the Respondent;

8: That the Respondents witness, James Spinale, did testify in Open Court, that he observed the Petitioner pulling up and stopping in the middle of the roadway, approximately twenty (20) feet from the Respondent, for the purposes of taking pictures on both dates;

9: That witness Spinale also testified that he observed others from both the Edgar County Watchdogs, a 501 (c) 4 organization, and various members of the Wesley Township Citizens Facebook Group conducting similar actions, on various dates and times, over a two (2) year period;

10: That after the Trial on June 15, 2020, the Petitioner, along with others, waited in the parking lot of the Wilmington City Hall Annex Court for the Respondent Norton to exit the building;

11: That the Respondent was escorted to his vehicle by a Will County Sheriffs Deputy as the Petitioner and others attempted to taunt and harass the Respondent;

12: That the Deputy told the Respondent that he would inform the Honorable Judge Jessica Colon-Sayre of what he observed at the time;

13: That all the aforementioned statements were recorded in the notes of the Honorable Judge Jessica Colon-Sayre to be impounded and filed in Court records;
