This establishment refuses to cooperate with public health authorities. A positive COVID-19 case was connected to this facility on August 8, 2020. The positive case resulted in a staff exposure. Manager of the establishment was uncooperative and refused to assist the local health department in identifying close contacts. On September 2, 2020 an additional positive case was associated with the facility. Two patron exposures occurred as close contacts and one of those contacts became positive. September 4, 2020 an additional positive case was connected to the facility and four additional patron exposures. Establishment once again would not cooperate with local health authorities with gathering close contacts. Manager was rude and wanted to wait several days before giving contact information for those who were exposed. Our facility never received close contacts for these cases. September 21, 2020 two additional positive cases were associated with On the Tracks Cafe. On September 29, an additional positive case was connected to the facility. There have been several community complaints about this facility not enforcing or using masks/face coverings, social distancing, and capacity limits. On September 14, 2020 staff from Edgar County Public Health Department visited the facility for a routine food inspection and an infection control review. A first non-compliance letter was issued regarding the use of face covering/masks and capacity limits. Facility was given until September 15, 2020 to comply. On October 1, two more community complaints were called into our office regarding no masks wearing, socially distancing, and capacity limits. On October 7, 2020 staff from Edgar County Public Health Department visited the facility for a compliance check. Establishment had made absolutely no effort to comply with Section 690.50. Observation included no masks being worn by patrons or staff. No signage was displayed to promote social distancing or the use of masks. Tables were not spaced 6feet apart. No visual cues were on the floor and booths were not marked to use every other booth. On October 8, 2020 ECPHD staff issued a second non-compliance order. Upon entering the facility, no masks were worn by employees or patrons. Manager refused to sign the second compliance letter and stated she would give it to her attorney. She stated she would not change anything until she was served with a court order. This establishment is blatantly defying the non-compliance orders and refuses to comply with public health to help stop the spread of this virus. The establishment is putting the public at risk day after day as no effort has been made to comply. This establishment is currently open for dine in against the Illinois Resurgence Mitigation requirements that state restaurants are not to be open for dine in at this time during the COVID-19 Pandemic.

August 8, 2020

Positive case connected to On the Tracks Café. Staff exposure as close contact also noted by case investigator. Manager, Carla Fancher was uncooperative when asked to assist Public Health Department in identifying close contacts.

September 2, 2020

An additional positive case was associated with On the Tracks Café. 2 patron exposures occurred as close contacts. One of the two contacts became positive.

September 4, 2020

An additional positive case and four patron exposures were noted by case investigators and connected to On the Tracks Café.

Establishment was absolutely not cooperative with the local health authorities concerning gathering close contacts and exposures at the facility. Carla Fancher was rude and wanted to wait until Sunday to provide information. Carla was to call back.

September 5, 2020

Monica Dunn called Carla to gather the information of close contacts from the exposure at the facility the day before. Carla refused to provide needed information.

September 10, 2020

Complaint from community member about the facility not reducing capacity and not wearing masks.

September 14, 2020 @ 12:08

Monica Dunn and Marissa Beck visited the facility for a routine food inspection and an infection control review in response to several community complaints and investigation findings of positive COVID-19 cases connected to the facility.

As noted on the first notice of non-compliance letter, the facility was not in compliance for Section 690.50(c)(2) regarding the wearing of coverings and Section 690.50(c)(4) regarding capacity limits. Facility was given until September 15, 2020 to comply.

September 21, 2020

Two positive cases associated with On the Tracks Café.

September 29, 2020

An additional positive case associated with On the Tracks Café.

October 1, 2020

Two community complaints were called into the office regarding On the Tracks Café regarding no mask wearing, over capacity limits, and no social distancing.

October 7, 2020 @ 11:35AM

Janet Mason and Marissa Beck visited the facility for a compliance check. 20 total people were in the establishment including employees and patrons. Establishment has made absolutely no effort to comply with 77 III. Admin. Code 690.50 concerned the use of masks and capacity limits. Observation included no masks were worn by employees or patrons. No signage was displayed to promote social distancing or the use of masks. Tables were not spaced 6-feet apart. No visual cues were on the floor and booths were not marked to be used every other.

October 8, 2020:

Monica Dunn and Marissa Beck served the second notice of non-compliance to On the Track's Café around 2pm this afternoon. Upon entering the facility, no masks were worn by employees or patrons. No signage was displayed to promote social distancing or the use of masks. Tables were not spaced 6-feet apart. No visual cues were on the floor and booths were not marked to be used every other.

Carla Fancher, the person in charge and manager of the establishment was present. We served the second notice of non-compliance and explained there had been absolutely no effort to comply with the requirements of masks, social distancing, or capacity limits.

Carla did not sign the second notice of non-compliance document and stated she would give to her attorney, Tom Devoure. She stated she would not change anything until we served her with a court order.

Monica and Marissa Beck thanked her for her time, left a copy of the notice, and left the facility.
