

(55 ILCS 5/5-1049.2)

Sec. 5-1049.2. Lease of county property. The county board may lease real estate acquired or held by the county for any term not exceeding 99 years and may lease the real estate when, in the opinion of the county board, the real estate is no longer necessary, appropriate, required for the use of, profitable to, or for the best interests of the county. The authority to lease shall be exercised by an ordinance passed by three-fourths of the county board members then holding office, at any regular meeting or at any special meeting called for that purpose. However, the county board may authorize any county officer to make leases for terms not exceeding 2 years in a manner determined by the Board.

Speaker McPike: "Representative Currie."

Currie: "Thank you, Speaker. I too rise in support of the Motion to table Amendment 5 and also to clarify for the record that the Sponsor of Amendment 5 was not as it said on the pieces of paper that crossed your desks, Currie, it was in fact Curran, so there a mistake. I just wanted to make sure the record is clear that Amendment 5 was never mine. I think the argument about constitutionality is a sound one, and it does seem a little odd that we would take an area totally unrelated to school activities and say that if you drop out, this is what you may not do. I would imagine that were this to pass, it would be challenged in the courts and I'm pretty sure that the Legislature that voted for this measure would find itself on the losing side. I prefer not to call to the courts. I think the right vote is to say, let us make sure that this Amendment is not in Senate Bill 881 when it comes to a vote on final passage."

Speaker McPike: "Have all voted? Have all voted who wish? The Clerk will take the Motion. The Clerk will take the record. On this Motion, there are 40 'ayes' and 75 'noes', and the Motion fails. Any further Amendments?"

Clerk Rossi: "No further Amendments."

Speaker McPike: "Third Reading. Has this Bill...was this Bill read a second time previously?"

Clerk Rossi: "The Bill had not been read a second time previously."

Speaker McPike: "All right. This Bill cannot be heard today. It's on Third Reading. Senate Bill 95. Is that on Second or Third Reading? Is that on Second or Third Reading?"
