ISP is granting your request in part and denying your request in part. The request was denied in part because signatures in the records required redaction pursuant to:

Section 7(1)(b) of FOIA: “Subject to this requirement, the following shall be exempt from inspection and copying: (b) Private information, unless disclosure is required by another provision of this Act, a State or federal law, or a court order.” (5 ILCS 140/7(1)(b)).
