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- 1 THE COURT: Anybody ready?
- 2 MR. HURD: Yeah.
- 3 THE COURT: 19 CH 1143. Brzana, Grant, Wesley
- 4 Township, 19 CH 1143.
- 5 Good morning.
- 6 MR. HURD: Good morning.
- 7 MR. OLSWANG: Good morning, your Honor.
- Do you want to step up here?
- 9 THE COURT: No, I'd rather have you at the
- 10 lectern, frankly.
- MR. OLSWANG: Okay. Let me --
- 12 THE COURT: Well, welcome aboard.
- MR. HURD: Yeah.
- MR. OLSWANG: Glad to be here, Judge.
- Daniel Olswang, O-l-s-w-a-n-g, on behalf of
- 16 the plaintiff.
- 17 THE COURT: We'll see how long that lasts for,
- 18 okay?
- 19 You jumped on a grenade here, but I'm glad
- you're in the case.
- MR. OLSWANG: It seems so, Judge, yes.
- THE COURT: Okay.
- MR. HURD: And Matt Hurd on behalf of the
- defendants, your Honor.

- 1 THE COURT: Thank vou. 2 MR. HANLON: Your Honor, Robert Hanlon. I'm here because I received, via improper service, a motion for 3 sanctions. I'm a sitting state's attorney, so I can't 4 5 regularly appear here in your court. 6 And so I believe that that's the only thing, that I'm aware of, that pertains to me on your call. 7 And as the Court saw, this is a grenade kind of case. 8 Ι 9 don't see it being resolved completely anytime soon. 10 Might I ask the Court to stay the defendant's motion for sanctions until this case comes to its conclusion? 11 12 I should be out of office by that point in 13 time in which I could then fully participate with a full 14 breadth and the scope of the years that I litigated this case, addressing these ridiculous counterclaims that 15 16 ultimately got dismissed after years of discovery abuses 17 by the defendants. And it seems to me that that's 18 appropriate. I also note that Ms. Ambroziak had neuro 19 20
- surgery earlier this week, and she's going to be out for at least 12 weeks. 21
- 22 THE COURT: Okay. Well, let me put it this way. 23 If you have some complaint that you should not be part 24 of this motion, then there are ways of addressing that,

- 1 okay? But the fact that you're a public official at
- 2 this point is not going to, in any way, delay this case,
- 3 okay? Including the pending motion, okay?
- 4 You may need counsel to go ahead and address
- 5 the allegations. The allegations don't have anything to
- do with your -- your present position. But I'm going to
- 7 expect that anybody who is named in that motion is going
- 8 to address it. And if they don't, it will be
- 9 potentially at their own peril, okay?
- 10 All right. So we need to set a hearing date
- 11 on this. If you've got a motion to strike, a motion to
- stay as it pertains to you, I'm perfectly willing to
- 13 address that, okay?
- 14 Let's see now. Have you folks talked about
- 15 a hearing date?
- MR. HURD: We prefer -- I think the first thing to
- 17 address is the rule to show cause, which is -- was up
- last time, and your Honor held the hearing and was
- 19 continued to -- it was up in January --
- THE COURT: Okay. Here's what I'm going to do,
- 21 okay? I've got a number of people on Zoom. I've got
- 22 other attorneys that are --
- MR. HURD: Okay.
- 24 THE COURT: -- present in the courtroom. We'll

- 1 pass this to the end of the call, and then we'll figure
- 2 out where we're going on this.
- 3 MR. HURD: Thank you.
- 4 THE COURT: Okay. All right.
- 5 MR. OLSWANG: Judge, I just have somewhat of a
- 6 time commitment. I have to be in Rolling Meadows at
- 7 eleven, so...
- 8 THE COURT: I'm going to do my best to get you out
- 9 of here, okay?
- 10 MR. OLSWANG: Thank you. I appreciate that.
- 11 THE COURT: I don't think we're going to need a
- 12 lot of time on this. We just need to set a hearing
- 13 date, okay?
- MR. HURD: Thank you.
- 15 THE COURT: And determine whether the rule is
- 16 going to issue or not.
- Okay. Very good.
- 18 (Case passed and later recalled.)
- 19 THE COURT: Brzana and Wesley Township attorneys,
- why don't you come on back up, okay?
- 21 MR. OLSWANG: Good morning again, your Honor.
- 22 THE COURT: Good morning.
- 23 MR. OLSWANG: Daniel Olswang for the plaintiff.
- MR. HANLON: Good morning, your Honor.

- 1 Robert Hanlon, pro se.
- THE COURT: Okay.
- 3 MR. HURD: Matt Hurd, your Honor, for the
- 4 defendants.
- 5 THE COURT: Thank you.
- 6 All right. First of all, regarding the
- 7 petition for rule, okay?
- That's a verified petition, Mr. Hurd?
- 9 MR. HURD: No, it was not, your Honor.
- 10 THE COURT: All right. Well, that means you're
- going to need to present some evidence in order to get a
- rule to show cause issued.
- MR. OLSWANG: Your Honor, I did not know this was
- 14 up today. I checked the docket. It looked like it was
- 15 set for status of the case and for the --
- 16 THE COURT: Yeah.
- MR. OLSWANG: -- plaintiff to show up; she didn't
- 18 and I'm here and --
- 19 MR. HURD: Your Honor, if this matter was up --
- THE COURT: Hold on. Hold on.
- 21 First of all --
- MR. HURD: Okay.
- 23 THE COURT: -- number one rule, don't --
- MR. HURD: Okav.

- 1 THE COURT: -- interrupt each other, okay?
- 2 MR. HURD: Sorry.
- 3 THE COURT: All right. That's my number one pet
- 4 peeve.
- 5 MR. OLSWANG: Okay.
- 6 THE COURT: Okay. Because, otherwise, this might
- 7 as well just be a conversation out on the --
- 8 MR. HURD: Okay.
- 9 THE COURT: -- street, okay?
- 10 It's your record. I'm sure you want a good
- one. And when, folks, you interrupt each other, it
- 12 causes a problem, okay?
- 13 All right. Let's see now. You know, I
- mentioned the last time, or implied the last time, that
- 15 I thought this motion filed as a petition for rule was
- 16 really kind of mischaracterized and it's more in the
- 17 nature of a motion for sanctions, and you have filed
- 18 that since then. I'm not -- I mean, the -- you know, I
- 19 asked the last time around, "Is it a petition for
- 20 indirect civil contempt? Is it direct civil contempt?"
- 21 And I don't think I really got an answer on that. So I
- thought, when you filed the motion for sanctions, that
- that was essentially what you were going to proceed on
- instead of the petition for rule.

- 1 MR. HURD: Can I remind your Honor as to one thing
- 2 you said?
- 3 THE COURT: Go ahead.
- 4 MR. HURD: So, first of all, you ordered Tim Grant
- 5 here today. You've ordered Tim Grant here at the last
- 6 hearing. He has showed up to neither. Tim Grant did
- 7 not show up for his deposition. It was barred. I asked
- 8 for Tim Grant to be dismissed then and I asked Tim Grant
- 9 to be dismissed the last time, and you said you would
- 10 take care of it this time. So since Mr. Grant has shown
- 11 no interest in this litigation, I'd ask that he be
- 12 dismissed.
- 13 THE COURT: Okay. Well, let's go back to the
- issue as far as the rule and the --
- MR. HURD: Okay.
- 16 THE COURT: -- and the motion for sanctions.
- 17 MR. HURD: You said last time --
- 18 THE COURT: Hold on. Hold on.
- MR. HURD: Okay.
- THE COURT: Okay. First of all, is there any
- 21 objection -- Mr. Hanlon has got an objection to setting
- the petition for sanctions as it pertains to him, and
- 23 I'm -- and I want to hear him out on that.
- What about -- let's see now. Mr. Olswang,

- 1 you represent just Cynthia?
- 2 MR. OLSWANG: If I need to file my appearance for
- 3 Mr. Grant, I will as well, your Honor. I didn't
- 4 realize -- that was made in my --
- 5 THE COURT: Well --
- 6 MR. OLSWANG: -- mistake.
- 7 THE COURT: Well, that's up to you.
- 8 MR. OLSWANG: Yes. No, no, and I will --
- 9 THE COURT: Okay. If you're telling me you're
- 10 going to file an appearance for him, then I'll give you
- a bit of time to do that, and we'll set all this for
- 12 hearing.
- 13 Your client is here today?
- MR. HURD: Yes.
- 15 THE COURT: Okay. All right. Is there any
- objection, other than by Mr. Hanlon, to setting the
- motion for sanctions for hearing?
- I'm not hearing one, okay.
- MR. HANLON: Your Honor, may I just speak to that
- 20 for --
- THE COURT: Yes.
- 22 MR. HANLON: -- a quick second?
- THE COURT: Go ahead.
- 24 MR. HANLON: A substantial portion on that motion

- is directed at a person who wasn't properly served.
- 2 Ms. Ambroziak's appearance has been gone for more than
- 3 30 days from the time that the order was entered
- 4 allowing her to leave. They sent an e-mail, which they
- 5 copied me on, with respect to service on her. I know
- 6 that she had neuro surgery this week, so I don't see how
- 7 she could possibly respond to any of this anytime soon.
- 8 And I can't -- I'm not speaking for her with
- 9 respect to that issue of service. And I, of course, am
- 10 not objecting to the service because I just assume, get
- 11 this done. However, I'm down to one person, which is me
- in my office, to manage the entire docket for the entire
- 13 county, you know, until I get someone coming back into
- my office. And today is actually the last day of my
- assistant, who's moving to Champaign County.
- MR. OLSWANG: Your Honor, if I may comment?
- 17 THE COURT: Yeah, go ahead.
- 18 MR. OLSWANG: I'm -- obviously, I'm going to need
- 19 the assistance -- well, assistance -- but I'm going to
- 20 need to work with Mr. Hanlon and with Ms. Ambroziak
- 21 because they're way more familiar with what went on over
- four years of this case than -- I'm trying to play catch
- 23 up. So if Ms. Ambroziak is not available, that's going
- to be problematic for me trying to respond on behalf of

- 1 my client and Mr. Grant.
- 2 MR. HURD: Your Honor, if I --
- 3 THE COURT: Well, Counsel, I think you get into
- 4 this case at your own peril.
- 5 MR. OLSWANG: Yes.
- THE COURT: Okay?
- 7 MR. HURD: Can I add just one thing?
- 8 THE COURT: Go ahead.
- 9 MR. HURD: As the Court may recall, I have surgery
- scheduled for April 17th.
- 11 THE COURT: Okay.
- MR. HURD: I will be off my feet, on my back for
- 13 five weeks. And then --
- 14 THE COURT: Okay.
- MR. HURD: -- with any luck at all, I'll be put in
- 16 a boot and then I can move.
- 17 THE COURT: Well, it sounds like nobody is in a
- 18 position to really go ahead on these motions. And I'm
- 19 not even sure about Mr. Hanlon's ability to represent
- 20 himself in an individual capacity, or whether
- 21 that's -- you know, that's up to him whether that's
- 22 advisable or not.
- It seems to me that I should set this case
- for a date after your surgery, Mr. Hurd. You can log in

- on Zoom. And we'll see where Ms. Ambroziak is at at
- 2 that point, okay?
- And with that being the case, I'm going to
- 4 give Mr. Olswang an opportunity to file an appearance
- for Mr. Grant so that Mr. Olswang knows whether he's got
- 6 a client there and Mr. Grant knows whether he's got a
- 7 lawyer, okay?
- Because, frankly, if I struck Mr. Grant's
- 9 complaint with an attorney here saying he intends on
- 10 filing an appearance for him, I think that would be
- 11 reversed so quickly our collected heads would spin,
- 12 okay?
- So why don't you folks talk about an
- 14 appropriate date in late July. I don't need you
- physically present in the courtroom. I would like to
- 16 get this case back on track. It is the -- one of the
- 17 oldest cases in the division and it's, I think, one of
- 18 the five or six oldest cases that I've got on my call.
- 19 And I do want to move this towards a conclusion, okay?
- Mr. Hanlon, if you believe you're not
- 21 properly named in this petition or some of that, file
- the appropriate motion. We'll deal with it. But we'll
- 23 give everybody a chance to get up to speed on this,
- 24 okav?

- 1 MR. HURD: Your Honor --
- THE COURT: Yes.
- 3 MR. HURD: -- if I can just add?
- 4 THE COURT: Yeah.
- 5 MR. HURD: You said at the last hearing, after the
- 6 January hearing, you said you were going to bar
- 7 Ms. Brzana from testifying. Then at the February
- 8 hearing, you said, "Now, on the next court date, I'm
- 9 going to decide whether this rule should issue. And I
- 10 can't find any reason at this point, from what I've
- 11 heard, that the rule shouldn't issue. And we'll deal
- 12 with that that day or thereabouts and the reason why
- this deposition hasn't taken place."
- 14 THE COURT: Okay. So what would you like me to
- 15 do?
- MR. HURD: Your Honor, I would like Ms. Brzana to
- 17 be barred. I would like Mr. Grant to be barred. That
- 18 Ms. Brzana has failed to show up for four depositions.
- 19 She failed to show up at a court hearing the last time.
- 20 She's here this time.
- THE COURT: Okay.
- MR. HURD: Mr. Grant has failed to show up at the
- court hearing the last time. He's failed to show up
- 24 this time.

- 1 THE COURT: Okay.
- 2 MR. HURD: I'm just making my record.
- 3 THE COURT: Okay. All right. Well, I'm not going
- 4 to do that today.
- 5 MR. HURD: Okay.
- 6 THE COURT: All right.
- 7 MR. OLSWANG: Judge, we could take any date in
- 8 July.
- 9 THE COURT: I mean, because frankly, for all I
- 10 know, counsel is going to talk to you out in the hall
- 11 and attempt to set a date for that deposition.
- MR. HURD: And I would --
- 13 THE COURT: All right.
- MR. HURD: -- strenuously object to that
- deposition.
- 16 THE COURT: Okay. All right. Well, let me put it
- this way. I don't think anybody is going to look kindly
- on this if counsel gets into the case, is able to
- 19 present her for a deposition and I say, "Nope, too late.
- 20 Can't do it."
- So I'll see you folks in July.
- MR. HURD: And there's --
- THE COURT: See if you can agree on a date. And
- that's going to be to select a hearing date on these

- 1 motions, okay?
- 2 Strongly suggest you try to get that
- 3 deposition done or at least get it set in the meantime.
- 4 MR. HURD: So four times, the Court orders a
- 5 deposition; four times --
- 6 THE COURT: Don't ask a hypothetical question --
- 7 MR. HURD: Four times --
- 8 THE COURT: -- here, okay?
- 9 MR. HURD: -- the plaintiff does not show up --
- 10 THE COURT: Mr. Hurd, you don't get to interrupt
- $11 \quad \text{me.}$
- MR. HURD: I wasn't.
- 13 THE COURT: All right?
- MR. HURD: I was -- thought I had this floor.
- THE COURT: And you don't get to ask me a
- 16 hypothetical question either, okay? That's -- you can
- deal with that at your hearing on your motion for
- 18 sanctions.
- Okay. All right. Yes?
- MR. OLSWANG: So just to recap, we're going to
- 21 enter and continue both motions for setting of a hearing
- 22 date. It's someday in July.
- 23 THE COURT: Correct.
- 24 MR. OLSWANG: I'll get leave to file my appearance

- 1 for Mr. Grant. I will -- and we'll set a date in July.
- 2 That's -- anything else in the order?
- 3 THE COURT: Correct, okay.
- And hopefully, Mr. Hanlon, your situation
- 5 will be able to be straightened away, okay? And we'll
- 6 go from there.
- 7 MR. OLSWANG: Any day of the week is okay with the
- 8 Court?
- 9 THE COURT: Yeah, any day of the week is fine.
- 10 There really aren't any dates in July that are bad.
- MR. HURD: Would you like it on ten o'clock?
- 12 THE COURT: Let's do it at nine o'clock. I'm
- assuming you're going to be online.
- MR. HURD: Okay.
- MR. OLSWANG: Can we -- can I appear at least on
- 16 Zoom?
- 17 THE COURT: You could -- you can all appear on
- 18 Zoom.
- MR. OLSWANG: Okay.
- THE COURT: Okay. And I'll just have all of
- 21 Wesley County in the courtroom, but no lawyers, okay?
- 22 All right. Or Wesley Township. Excuse me.
- 23 All right?
- MR. OLSWANG: Thank you, Judge.

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THE COURT: So that's fine. The only time I need

      you physically present here in the courtroom is if it's

      a contested matter.
