ORDINANCE NO. 10-1-24

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING AND ESTABLISHING THE COMPENSATION AND BENEFITS FOR CERTAIN ELECTED OFFICIALS OF THE VILLAGE OF ROBBINS, COOK COUNTY, ILLINOIS, STATE OF ILLINOIS.

WHEREAS, the Village of Robbins, County of Cook, State of Illinois (the "Village") is a home rule municipality pursuant to Section 6(a), Article VII of the 1970 Constitution of the State of Illinois, and as such may exercise any power and perform any function pertaining to its government and affairs (the "Home Rule Powers"); and

WHEREAS, the Illinois Constitution prohibits the increase or decrease in the salary of an elected official of any local government to take effect during the term for which that officer is elected; and

WHEREAS, compensation of elected officials must be fixed pursuant to Sections 3.1-50-5 and 3.1-50-10 of the Illinois Municipal Code and provisions of the Local Government Officer Compensation Act (50 ILCS 15/1, et seq.); and

WHEREAS, in accordance with the above statutes, the compensation of elected Village officials must be set by ordinance at least 180 days before the beginning of the terms of the office of those officers;

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Board of Trustees (the "Corporate Authorities") of the Village have the authority to establish benefits and compensation and from to time, supplement and amend compensation for elected officials of the Village of Robbins, with any changes in compensation to take effect upon the start of new terms of office; and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities have determined that it is in the best interests of the Village to amend prior the provision(s) of the Municipal Code relating to elected official compensation in order to update, clarify, and streamline same.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and the Board of Trustees for the Village of Robbins, County of Cook, State of Illinois, by and through its home rule powers, as follows:

Section 1. Recitals and Legislative Findings

The above recitals and legislative findings are found to be true and correct and are hereby incorporated herein and made a part thereof, as if fully set forth in their entirety.

Section 2. Compensation for the Office of Mayor.

- A. Following the April 1, 2025, Consolidated Election, and upon the commencement of the new term in office, the annual salary of the Mayor of the Village of Robbins,

Illinois shall be \$70,000.00. Said salary will be paid in equal installments in accordance with the Village's payroll policies and shall be subject to applicable payroll deductions.

- B. The Mayor may participate in the Illinois Municipal Retirement Fund (IMRF) if the Mayor meets the eligibility requirements.
- C. All other compensation for acting as Local Liquor Commissioner, shall remain the same and shall be paid in equal installments in accordance with the Village's payroll policies and subject to applicable payroll deductions.

Section 3: Compensation for the Office of Village Clerk

- A. Following the April 1, 2025, Consolidated Election, and upon the commencement of the new term in office, the annual salary of the Village Clerk of the Village of Robbins, Illinois shall be \$55,000.00. Said salary will be paid in equal installments in accordance with the Village's payroll policies and shall be subject to applicable payroll deductions.
- B. The base salary of the Village Clerk shall also be increased for each of the following certifications: (i) by the sum of \$500.00 for Registered Municipal Clerk, (ii) by the sum of \$1000.00 for Certified Municipal Clerk, and (iii) by the sum of \$1500.00 for Master Municipal Clerk.
- C. The Village Clerk may participate in the Illinois Municipal Retirement Fund (IMRF) if the Village Clerk meets the eligibility requirements.

Section 4: Compensation for the Board of Trustees

- A. Following the April 1, 2025, Consolidated Election, and upon the commencement of the first-time elected official in office, the annual salary of the Trustee of the Village of Robbins, Illinois shall be \$500.00 per month. Said salary will be paid in equal installments in accordance with the Village's payroll policies and shall be subject to applicable payroll deductions.
- B. Following the April 1, 2025, Consolidated Election, and upon the commencement of a re-elected official or an official with remaining years of current term in office, the annual salary of the Trustee of the Village of Robbins, Illinois shall be \$1000.00 per month. Said salary will be paid in equal installments in accordance with the Village's payroll policies and shall be subject to applicable payroll deductions.
- C. The Trustee may participate in the Illinois Municipal Retirement Fund (IMRF), if the Trustee meets the eligibility requirements.

Section 5. Severability.

If any provision of this Ordinance or application thereof to any person or circumstances is ruled unconstitutional or otherwise invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of this Ordinance that can be given effect without the invalid application or provision, and each invalid provision or invalid application of this Ordinance is severable.

Section 6. Repealer.

All ordinances, resolutions, motions, orders, or parts thereof, in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby expressly repealed to the extent of such conflict.


Section 7: Effective Date.

This Ordinance, except as otherwise specifically set forth herein, shall be in full force and effect immediately following its passage, approval and publication, as provided by law. Any and all increases for compensation for elected officials as provided pursuant to this Ordinance shall be effective at the earliest time as provided for under State law.


